Are you buying ice for a picnic? The bag is recyclable—return it to the store along with your other plastic bags. Remove any metal closures and let the bag dry out. Our [blog](#) provides more information on the bags and films that you can and can't recycle.



Yes, plastic lids and caps are recyclable. Just put them back on the plastic bottles and containers from which they came. Food is not recyclable. It contaminates recyclables it comes into contact with which can condemn them to the landfill. It also smells and draws pests. Food waste can be [composted](#) or [reduced](#).



Netted or mesh bags used for pre-packaged fruits and vegetables are not recyclable. These bags are typically made from a different plastic resin, such as nylon or polypropylene (#5).
