Anything around your house with Danger, Warning or Caution on the label is recyclable. Shipping materials such as cardboard, bubble wrap, and air pillows – all recyclable. At your St. Patrick's Day party, recycle aluminum and steel (tin) cans, glass bottles and jars, and plastic bottles, containers, and shopping bags. All batteries are recyclable: rechargeable (phone, tablet, rechargeable tools), single-use (AA, 9-volt, button), and lead-acid (car, boat, ATV). Find a spot to recycle them at RecycleSpot.org.
